Songs such as *"Faith of our Mothers," "If I could hear my Mother Pray Again,"* and *"Thank you Momma for praying for me"* all sounded so beautiful. One of our senior mothers read the scripture ***"Who can find a Virtuous woman."***

As we sang, *"Onward Christian Mothers,"* those who had their mom present, pinned a red rose on her. Those whose moms were passed away placed a white rose on the Bible in memory of



her. This Newfoundland tradition has been in the church for years and it always brings a blessing.

We are thankful and excited to share reports of miracles which have taken place in our midst recently. God is faithful to hear and answer the prayers of His people. We serve an awesome God! Below is one miracle experienced by our brother, Jeremy Adams, of Roddickton. This is the testimony he gave at one of our services since he returned from the hospital.

*I see a band of love! We pull together – when the prayers go up it seems like it’s almost impossible for it to be stopped. There is so much love!*

*It was in March of 2016 that I was taken down with the flu. Of course, I am not the type of person who likes to go to the hospital. I had a bad flu and it seemed I recovered, but overnight it struck me hard again. My mom stayed with me at my house because I was so sick. As I was lying there, mom said, “Why don’t you go to the hospital?” I said, “Nah, I will be ok.” Then for a little while I was doing well again. But that same night, I got so bad I could barely talk. I called Pastor Chris and he could hear I was desperate. I just asked him to pray for me. I was having difficulty breathing, so I decided I would go to the hospital. Some things I cannot even remember, due to the fact my temperature was so high. They kept me at the hospital for five days but I steadily grew worst. I do remember while in the hospital at Roddickton, grabbing onto the bed rails, chewing on fisherman’s friends, throat lozenges. I could hardly breathe! It was then I became scared. I prayed but I was still scared. I remember my mom came in and I said, “Mom, put your hand on me and pray for me please, I’m afraid.”*

*They took me to the emergency room and hooked me up to oxygen. The physicians and technicians did not say anything at that time. I was put on eighty percent oxygen. It was decided that I would need to go to St. Anthony, a hospital one and a half hours drive away. They got me ready and took me by ambulance. Again, they did not tell me what was going on. Upon arriving at the hospital in St. Anthony, I was placed in the Intensive Care Unit with possible heart failure. I was filling up on the lungs. It was coming on so fast! I was told this after, because I was unaware of what was going on. I do remember after I was settled in the ICU, opening my eyes and everything was blurry, but I could see this man with a shirt and tie on. It was Pastor Chris! I was so glad to see him! He laid his hands on me and prayed! It felt so good.*

*The doctor came in and said, “Jeremy, we want to put you on life support because your body is shutting down, otherwise you will not make it.” My first reaction was NO! I didn’t want to go on life support. The doctor went to my wife and explained the situation. We made the decision to accept the life support. Then I was out! My temperature was extremely high. Ice packs were placed on my body. They decided to airlift me to St. John’s hospital, where I could get more advanced care.*

*For the next two weeks, my family went through more than I did because I was sedated and I wasn’t aware of anything that was going on.*

*Before I regained consciousness, I had a dream of being in a wonderful place. It seemed to me that I was lifted up and put down in this beautiful place where my feet were in the sand. I was pointed to a certain spot and as I looked in that direction I saw this beautiful pearl, the water was swooshing around like a whirlpool. Then I looked across, I could see a sea of glass and more pearls. I saw other things but it seemed like it was just too much to describe. It was too advanced for me to explain. I believe if the Lord was going to take me then that’s the spot I would be in. I believe it was a part of Heaven.*

*You can have all the equipment, all the medicine in the world, but God makes the final decision as to whether we live or die.*



*There was so much love and so many prayers that God came to me and said, “Jeremy, I cannot take you, it’s time to wake up, I got work for you to do.”*

*I recall the day the staff sat me up. I was still on life support but I was back to myself like I am now. I was bouncing back really fast because the man from Galilee came to visit me. It is just so great to be acquainted with God and to have that assurance. You can have all the insurance in the world but it won’t save you. You must be covered by the blood.*

*I remember what a relief it was when they disconnected me from the life support equipment. I said, “Hello.” My voice was harsh. Then I said, “Thank you Jesus!” Mom gave me the phone to call dad. I said “hello, you know what? I just came back to life!” I could hear it in his voice that he was so excited. I know he was overwhelmed and happy that I came back to life.*

*I remember my wife, Sherri-Lee, was in such a dark place during this ordeal, but Hannah, our daughter, kept the faith! She was the strongest of us all. Hannah went to her mom and told her not to cry. She said, “Remember the story of Mary and Lazarus in the Bible and how he was dead for four days. You know what? Jesus was right on time.” Sherri-Lee was so encouraged by this.*

*Sherri-Lee would read the cards and messages that were sent to us and I was just amazed with all the support and love. I never thought there would be such a wonderful outpouring of love, prayers and support. The saints, the Men’s Fellowship group, the Ladies Group and others prayed for me. We have such good, caring people. The*

medical team working with me came and told me they didn't think it was possible for me to come so far in such a short time, but I said, "**With God all things are possible.**" My kidneys had shut down, so I was put on dialysis but I am no longer on kidney dialysis! My kidneys are fully functioning. Praise God!

I am so glad to have a family and we are all together. I am so glad to be in church tonight. It is a privilege. When I look around, I see and feel a band of love.

There is still some nerve damage in my leg and I have a limp foot but I am moving forward with God. I am so glad to be part of this gospel. I am glad to be acquainted with God and to be part of this church.



### Bide Arm



Monday the evacuation was lifted and it seemed we were not in any danger. May 3, Tuesday morning, we woke up to a beautiful morning, no smell of smoke and no sign of fire. Between 1:00 and 1:30 p.m. smoke began to bellow in over the city from a NW direction. We were downtown, approximately eight to ten minutes from Beacon Hill. We decided to go home. People were leaving our neighborhood and by the time we packed a few things, we had to flee from the fast approaching fire. In every



direction you looked there was fire, gridlock, as well as fear on people's faces, but thank God for prayer. Explosions were happening all around us. We knew the only hope for us, for the saints and the people of our city was a miracle from Heaven. We prayed, **"God get us out alive!"** There are many testimonies to be told. It wasn't long and we were able to be in contact with different ones from the church. How thankful we are to say God brought deliverance by a High and Mighty hand. No other power could have done it.

There is safety and protection in Jesus and we give Him all the praises. News reporters and people are telling the story of God's amazing grace in such a fiery trial. To God be the glory, His Word is established forever in **Isaiah 43:1-2** *"Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by thy name; thou art mine. When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee: when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee."*
